STAGE 1 PRELIMINARY EXAMINATION (MCQ TYPE)

Purpose: The primary purpose of this examination is to shortlist the candidates for the next stage of the recruitment process. It aims to identify qualified candidates who demonstrate the essential competencies and potential to excel in the desired position.

This preliminary examination will be conducted where the number of applicants are more than 6 (six) in respective subjects.


PROPOSED SCHEME, TEST FORMAT AND QUESTION TYPES

Note: Ratio of Ayurveda & Modern questions will be proportionate to the syllabus.

The Preliminary Examination will be conducted in the format of Multiple-Choice Questions (MCQs). Candidates will be presented with a set of questions, and for each question, 4 options (One correct answer and 3 distracters) will be provided. Candidates have to select the best nearby correct answer from the given choices.



Details of examination:

- ✓ The duration of the Preliminary Examination will be **90 minutes**.
- ✓ Candidates must manage their time effectively to answer the questions within the stipulated duration.
- ✓ **Reporting Time:** Sixty minutes before the commencement of the examination
- ✓ **Test schedule & venue** will be declared in advance by the institute.
- ✓ **Test format** - Multiple Choice Questions (MCQs)
- ✓ **Total marks:** 100 marks
- ✓ OMR Sheets will be provided for answering the questions.
- ✓ The candidates are instructed to fill the respective columns legibly using blue/black ball pen.
- ✓ You have to select the most appropriate option for each question and **mark the answer legibly** in the space provided against the respective question.
- ✓ **Language of Question paper** will be English; however, the technical words of Ayurveda/ verses will be provided in Sanskrit.
- ✓ **Specific instructions for the examination day**, if any will be informed by the institute.

SCORING AND EVALUATION CRITERIA FOR MCQS-BASED TEST

Correct Answer: Each correct answer will be awarded **1 mark**.

Incorrect Answer: For each incorrect answer, **0.25 (1/4)** mark will be deducted from the total score as negative marking.

- ✓ In response to any single question; if the candidate darkens **more than one circle** and/ or **overwriting** and/ or **incomplete darkening of the circle** will be treated as a WRONG answer. Few more examples of wrong methods are given in the image as an example. These wrong answering methods will be considered as incorrect answer and **0.25 (1/4)** mark will be deducted from the total score.

- ✓ **Unanswered questions** will not be awarded any marks, nor will any marks be deducted for leaving a question unanswered.
- ✓ Complaints against the **ambiguous questions**, if any, should be submitted to the Examination Centre Superintendent on the same day of the examination, after which no complaint will be entertained. The decision on such ambiguous questions will be taken by the competent authority.

TOTAL SCORE CALCULATION

- ✓ **Sum of Correct Answers:** The total score for the examination will be calculated by summing the marks awarded for each correct answer.
- ✓ **Negative Marking Adjustment:** In case of incorrect answers, the negative marking will be subtracted from the total score.
- ✓ **No Impact of Unanswered Questions:** Leaving questions will not impact the total score calculation.

TOTAL MARKS AND WEIGHTAGE

The Preliminary Examination carries a total weightage of 100 marks. Each question contributes to the overall score of the candidate. The marks obtained in the Preliminary Examination will play a significant role in determining candidates' eligibility for next stage of the recruitment process.

- ✓ **Qualifying Criteria:** To get shortlisted for the next stage i.e. Interview (Stage 2) of the recruitment process, candidate must appear for the written test.
- ✓ Based upon the merit obtained in this test, the applicants will be shortlisted for the Interview (Stage 2).
- ✓ Suppose for a single post of Assistant Professor in general category, 100 candidates appeared in preliminary exam. To select candidates for next stage, maximum top 5 candidates in preliminary exam will be selected for Stage 2 (Interview) according to their merit score in preliminary exam. However, if there are equal marks of candidates for 5th rank, all those candidates having 5th rank in preliminary exam merit will be eligible for Stage 2 (Interview).

Note: *The NEIAFMR, Pasighat, Arunachal Pradesh reserves the right to modify or amend the Examination process as deemed appropriate and same will be notified accordingly.*



STAGE 2: INTERVIEW

After the preliminary exam, the candidates who qualify as per the specified criteria (mentioned above) will be called for the interview. The selection for the interview will be based on the consolidated merit of preliminary examination.

In case, if the number of applicants is six or less than six in respective subjects; all such applicants will be called for the interview.

Location and Schedule will be informed to the candidates in advance. The venue may vary based on the availability and convenience.

Candidates are expected to check the website (www.neiafmr.org.in) regularly for updates & announcements related to the recruitment process.

Interview Assessment Criteria: The Interview panel will evaluate the candidates primarily in the domain of related subject. Besides, their performance in practical application also will be considered. Communication skills, Interpersonal skills, Leadership potential, Emotional intelligence, Self-motivated nature, Problem solving & Critical thinking abilities, Flexibility to work in a team, Ethical and Professional functioning, etc. will be additionally seen during the interview.

Power-point Presentation: The shortlisted candidates may be asked for a demo lecture, as a part of the interview.
